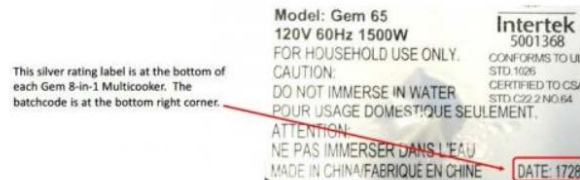
Intertek Warns of Hazardous Double Insight Multi Cookers Bearing an ETL Certification Mark

The following is a notification from Intertek that the Double Insight Multi Cookers identified below bearing Intertek Certification Marks for the United States and Canada have been determined to pose a public hazard.

Reported Hazards	<i>A manufacturer defect can cause the multi cooker to overheat and melt on the underside, posing a fire hazard.</i> <i>See CPSC Recall Notice: Double Insight Recall (18-110)</i>
Sold at	<i>Walmart stores nationwide and online at www.walmart.com from August 2017 through January 2018.</i>
What to do	<i>Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled multi cookers, unplug the unit and return it to Walmart to receive a free replacement.</i>
